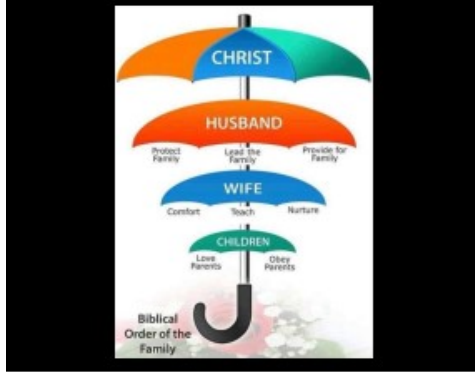


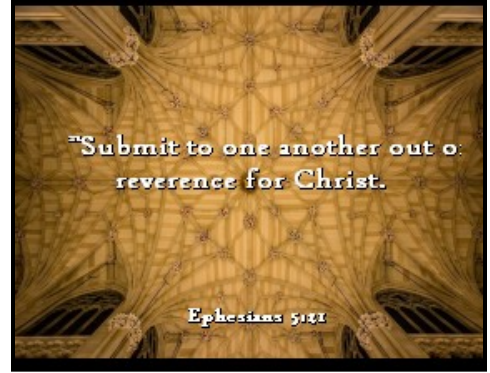

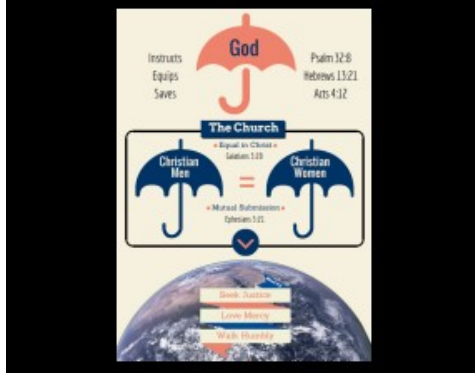

"Racial factors played no role; education was greatly encouraged (some slaves were better educated than their owners) and enhanced a slave's value; many slaves carried out sensitive and highly responsible social functions; slaves could own property (including other slaves); their religious and cultural traditions were the same as those of the freeborn; no laws prohibited public assembly of slaves; and (perhaps above all) the majority of urban and domestic slaves could legitimately anticipate being emancipated by the age of 30."

"Masters can give directions "with respect and fear," knowing that their slaves are really slaves of Christ who is Master of both slave and free (6:5, 8). Masters can exercise their authority "as slaves of Christ" who seek to do "the will of God" both in the context of their directions and in the way these are delivered (6:6). Masters can "warn wholeheartedly" in their oversight of slaves because they know that they will be rewarded by their heavenly Master if they exercise justice and mercy (6:7-8)."
